




Kūpuna: grandparent, ancestor, relative or close friend of the grandparent's generation; in this report, person of *age 60 or greater*.











Race/Ethnicity: PIT Kūpuna Population

- There approximately equal numbers of the chronically homeless and transitionally/episodically homeless—each constituted 47% of the total kūpuna population.
- The inability to pay rent (12%), loss of money or income source (9%), and job loss (10%) were the most commonly reported causes that led to homelessness.
- Native Hawaiians and Pacific Islanders were over-represented by 80%, while Blacks/African Americans were over-represented by 143% in comparison to the CoC's population as a whole.
- Six percent of kūpuna surveyed had served on active duty in the US military.

- The majority of kūpuna population had a disabling condition.
- Disabilities and chronically homeless status are more prevalent among the population as compared to the O'ahu PIT Count population.
- More than three quarters of unsheltered kūpuna had been homeless for an extended period of time, over 1 year.
- The largest percentage of unsheltered kūpuna were counted in Regions 1, 2 and 7.
