








AGE BREAKDOWN


RACE/ETHNICITY

Race/Ethnicity Alone (mutually exclusive categories)












- Veterans report having twice as many health conditions as compared the O'ahu PIT Count Population.
- The majority of veterans report having a disabling condition (mental health illness, substance use disorder, physical, developmental, or other disability, and/or HIV/AIDS) (71%). 30% (69) of individuals reported 2 disabling conditions and 16% (36) of individuals reported 3 or more disabling conditions.
- The vast majority of unsheltered veterans had currently been experiencing homelessness for an extended period of time, over 1 year.
