

OBSERVATIONS

- 19% of surveyed veterans said they had experienced homelessness before the age of eighteen.
- The most common self-reported causes that led to homelessness were lack of money or rent (32%), loss of job (18%), eviction (11%), and substance use problems (11%).
- Eight of the eighteen veterans who were eligible (being 50% Native Hawaiian) for housing from the Hawaiian Homelands program had applied and were on the wait list at the time of the survey.
- The vast majority of unsheltered veterans had currently been experiencing homelessness for an extended period of time (more than a year).





33% (36) of unsheltered veterans had pets. **42%** (15) of these pets were registered emotional support animals.




