History

Partners In Care (PIC) is Oahu's **Continuum of Care** as defined by the **HUD Health Act**. PIC is a coalition of 30 non-profit providers on Oahu whose collective mission is to end homelessness on Oahu.

Since October, 2013, PIC's partnership with the State Hawaii Inter-Agency Council on Homelessness (HICH), adopted Hale O'Malama, a new model of care for homelessness in Hawaii, based on national best practice, and 2.5 years of technical assistance from HUD and the Veterans Administration.

For 20 years, before adopting the Hale O'Malama system of care, PIC providers worked independently. In 2013, 30 PIC homeless providers changed their business models to work as a unified team using best practices, as part of the **25 Cities initiative** (www.25cities.com), housing people based on data, including the follow principles:

- **Coordinated entry** using the **VI-SPDAT** (Vulnerability Index Service Prioritization Decision Assistance Tool).
- **Coordinated housing placement**, housing the most vulnerable with a "housing first" model.
- **Wrap-around services** to support the successful tenancy of newly housed homelessness individuals.

Outcomes

General PIC-Homeless Data

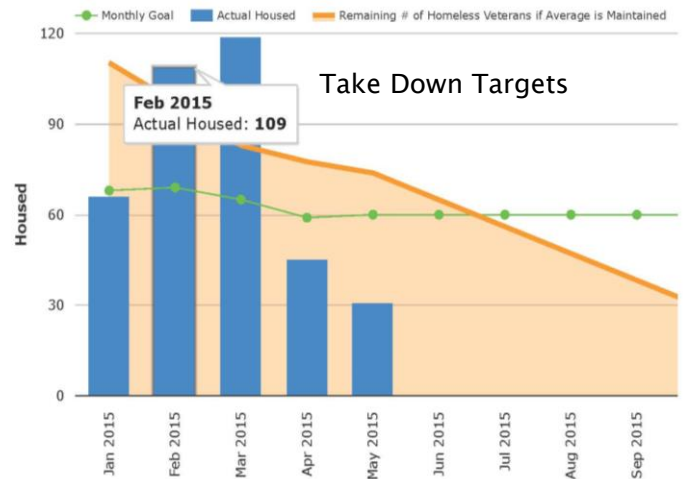
- ✓ 3,798 VI-SPDAT assessments completed.
- ✓ 32% require Permanent Supportive Housing (see below).
- ✓ 41% require Rapid Re-housing (see below).
- ✓ 25% require mainstream housing (see below).
- ✓ 61 years old ave age - Permanent Supportive Housing.
- ✓ 8 years ave time homeless for PSH individuals.
- ✓ 40% have serious mental illness.

Categories of Housing Need
 (Based on VI-SPDAT Score)

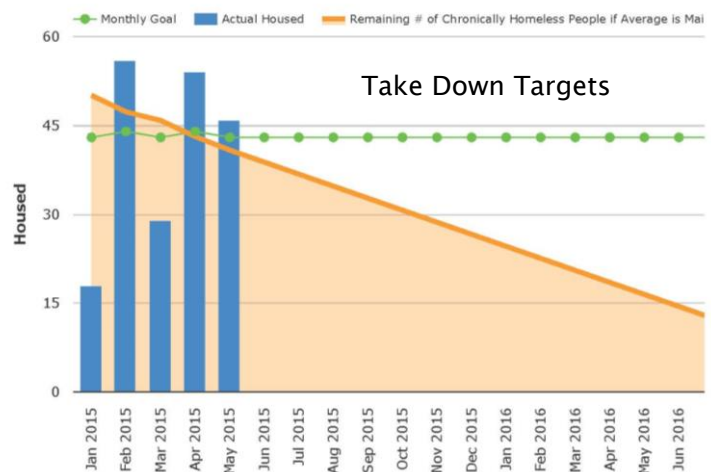
- **Score of 10-20: Permanent Supportive Housing (PSH)**
 Individuals or families who require permanent housing with rental subsidy and long-term ongoing access to services and intensive case management to remain stably housed.
- **Score of 5-9: Rapid Re-Housing (RRH)**
 Individuals or families who are likely to be able to achieve housing stability over a short period through medium or short-term housing support, and case management/services (usually no more than 6-9 months).
- **Score of 0-4: Mainstream / Usual Care**
 Individuals or families who do not require intensive support or case management, but may still benefit from access to more affordable housing.

Housing Placement Data

- ✓ **837 chronically homeless** persons placed into permanent housing from 7/1/14 to 6/30/15.
- ✓ **69 placements/month** "Take-Down Targets" for chronically homeless.
- ✓ **401 veterans** placed into permanent housing from 1/1/15 to 6/30/15 – Part of the "Mayor's Challenge".
- ✓ **66 placements/month** "Taken-Down Targets" for Veterans.
