NOTES	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • <u>Priority Order Within Priority Groups</u>: Providers will serve individuals with the highest VI-SPDAT score first. • <u>Tiebreaker for Identical VI-SPDAT Scores</u>: Providers will serve individuals who are document ready first. • <u>Timing</u>: Providers should spend up to two weeks attempting to locate the client and up to an additional two weeks (30 days total) attempting to get the client document ready. If a client cannot be located or made document ready within these time periods, they should be referred to case conferencing and placed back in the Community Queue to be considered for future housing opportunities. • <u>Monitoring</u>: Providers will be monitored on an ongoing, regular basis to ensure that they are complying with the prioritization order above and with objective methods of implementing VI-SPDAT assessments and scores. • <u>Role of Case Conferencing</u>: Case conferencing will be used to: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ○ Ensure that the document readiness of all clients is being addressed (beginning with those individuals in Priority Category 1); and, ○ Ensure that clients entering RRH with a VI-SPDAT score of 8+ otherwise meet prioritization criteria and have a substantial likelihood of success in an RRH program. 	•	•	•	•
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
